Odisha to host Athletics Continental Tour in August



Bhubaneswar (DMC): Odisha is all set to host the World Athletics Continental Tour (Bronze Level) for the first time at Kalinga Stadium here on August 10, 2025.

Informing this during a press conference held on Friday, Sports Minister SuryabanshiSuraj shared details of this prestigious international athletics competition.

The event will witness the participation of over 150 athletes representing more than 10 countries, including India, Turkmenistan, Bhutan, Philippines, South Korea, Malaysia, Iraq, Vietnam, Republic of Cameroon, Sri Lanka, Iran and the Maldives. A total of 20 events will be held during the tournament.

"This is a proud moment for Odisha," said the Sports Minister. "Hosting the World Athletics Continental Tour for the first time in our state reflects our commitment to sporting excellence. We are taking all necessary steps to ensure the event's smooth and successful conduct—from world-class infrastructure to hospitality."

He further added that Odisha has already created a distinct identity in hosting international sporting events. "Our athletes have brought laurels to the state by excelling in various global competitions. I am confident they will deliver outstanding performances in this tournament as well," he said.

Sandeep Mehta, Secretary General of the Athletics Federation of India, said, "We are proud to host the World Athletics Continental Tour (Bronze Level) in India. With world-class athletes competing, this promises to be a spectacular event and Odisha provides the perfect setting for its successful conduct."

The Tour is an annual series of independent track and field athletic competitions, recognised by World Athletics (formerly known as the IAAF). The Tour forms the second tier of international one-day meetings after the Diamond League. First held in 2020, it replaced the IAAF World Challenge series. Initially divided into three levels — Gold, Silver and Bronze — the Tour was expanded in 2022 with the fourth tier. Challenger

RS 802 CR PROJECT TO DECONGEST RAIL CORRIDOR IN STATE SOON

Bhubaneswar (DMC): Minister of Railways AshwiniVaishnaw has sanctioned the Cuttack–Nergundi 4th Line (15.99 km) along with a rail flyover at Nergundi, at an estimated cost of Rs 802.9 crore.

The East Coast Railway (ECoR), in a release on Friday, said that this project will significantly enhance the capacity and efficiency of train operations in Howrah–Chennai mainline section and Cuttack–Paradip section.

"The Cuttack-Nergundi section is part of the Howrah-Chennai High-Density Network (HDN). This corridor currently faces heavy congestion due to traffic from Paradip Port intersecting the mainline at Cuttack. With no direct junction arrangements at Cuttack for Talcher-bound trains, significant delays often occur due to surface-level crossings. The fourth line and rail flyover are designed to decongest this corridor by separating port-bound traffic from the mainline routes, particularly between Cuttack and Dhenkanal. This will help reduce detention of passenger and Mail/Express trains in the mainline section operating to and from Cuttack and Bhubaneswar," it

The ECoR further stated that Mail/Express trains are sometimes detained because of operational restrictions due to the crossing at Nergundi. "The sanctioned project will help ease these constraints, improve punctuality, and facilitate smoother movement of more coaching trains. It will also aid in the segregation of coaching and freight traffic in the section. Trains bypassing the mainline route will no longer be delayed, enhancing operational efficiency," it said.

Two new river bridges across the Mahanadi and Birupa rivers will also be constructed as part of the project. The line, including the flyover, will be equipped with Kavach safety features and a 2×25 kV electrified system, enabling a maximum permissible speed of 130 kmph, it added.

Students paraded in underwear during Goa University festival

Panaji (HS): The Goa State Human Rights Commission has issued notice to the vice-chancellor of Goa University over an alleged incident in which male students were paraded in their underwear

during a cultural festival at the institution earlier this year, an official said on Friday.

The commission on Thursday issued a notice to Vice-Chancellor Harilal B Menon, asking him to



appear before it and submit a reply by July 23. A senior official from the University said the incident occurred during an inter-departmental festival called "Frolic" held in February "During a competition called 'Third Degree', the jury asked the participants to strip to their underwear," he said. The rights panel took suo motu cognisance of a report about the incident that appeared in a newspaper this week. The commission, in its notice, stated that it was taking suo motu cognisance of the matter, which prima facie makes out violations of the human rights of the students.

Condemning the incident, National Students Union of India (NSUI) leader Naushad Chaud-

hury said that female students were part of the crowd that attended the festival.

"Students were not allowed to leave. It was an embarrassing situation for both male and female students present there," he said.

The NSUI has planned protests against the event. The opposition Goa Forward Party (GFP) was the first to bring the incident to the fore in the media. GFP chief Vijai Sardesai said that his party had questioned the authorities about the incident.

India successfully tests Astra missile with indigenous RF seeker

Bhubaneswar (DMC): The DRDO & IAF on Friday successfully test-fired beyond visual range air-to-air missile Astra with indigenous radio frequency (RF) seeker from Sukhoi-30 MK-I off Odisha coast.

According to the Ministry of Defence, two missiles were fired against high-speed unmanned aerial targets at different ranges, target aspects and launch platform conditions. Both tests achieved pinpoint accuracy, destroying the targets mid-air. "The flawless performance of the Astra weapon system was validated through flight data captured by range tracking instruments deployed at the Integrated Test Range in



Chandipur," it said.

These successful flight tests have re-established the accuracy

and reliable performance of Astra weapon system with indigenous seeker, the Ministry added.

Astra, with a strike range of over 100 km, gives pilots the ability to neutralise threats long

before they come into visual contact. In addition to various laboratories of DRDO, more than 50 public and private industries including Hindustan Aeronautics Limited have contributed towards development of the weapon system.

Notably, Odisha has imposed a two-day ban on marine fishing on July 17 and 18 in view of DRDO's scheduled missile tests from the Integrated Test Range (ITR) at Chandipur in Balasore district and Dr APJ Abdul Kalam Island in Bhadrak district. This temporary restriction applies to the coastal districts — Balasore, Bhadrak, Kendrapada, and Jagatsinghpur.

Pvt buses to resume services from today

Bhubaneswar (DMC): Commuters in Odisha can finally heave a sigh of relief as all private buses are set to hit the roads from tomorrow. The State Private Bus Owners' Association announced this decision following a crucial meeting held in Puri on Friday.

Bus operations had been paralysed across Odisha due to ongoing agitation by the drivers' association, leaving thousands stranded and affecting daily transport services. After detailed deliberations, the association decided to resume services, bringing an end to days of inconvenience, the bus owners' association president PriyabrataTripathy informed.

The State government will provide protection to private buses, the outfit secretary said in a press conference held after its key meeting.

"Keeping in mind the convenience of passengers, we decided to roll out the private buses from tomorrow," the association secretary, DebendraSahoo, said.

"The strike has already reached four days, starting from July 8 to July 11, and our staffers have become impatient. Hence, we want to run the buses. We will run the buses at any cost; otherwise, how will our families be managed?" PriyabrataTripathy questioned.

Meanwhile, the Cuttack bus owners' outfit has announced to run buses from Saturday as Mini Truck Owners' Association lodges complaint Bhubaneswar: The All Odisha Mini

Truck Owners' Association has lodged a formal complaint against the drivers' association President
PrashantMenduli and his associate Aditya Prasad Behera at the Mancheswar Police Station here on Friday.In the complaint, the Mini Trućk Owners' Association alleged that the Driver Association under the leadership of Menduli, is adopting undemocratic means to demand their rights. What began as a peaceful movement has allegedly turned aggressive and violent.As per the complaint the truck owners and drivers not participating in the protest are being harassed and humiliated. The Association claims that such acts are being orchestrated by PrashantMenduli and his associate Aditya Prasad Behera. They have demanded strict legal action against the individuals and the association involved, warning that failure to curb such actions may lead to a breakdown in the law and order situation across the state. "Some truck owners and drivers are being harassed and humiliated. We strongly condemn the incident," said Ganesh Mahari, President of All Odisha Mini Truck

well. Sambalpur drivers' association president Jayanarayan-Mahana said, "When the drivers are agitating on the roads, who else will drive the buses? Would the owners drive the vehicles?"

"The bus owners' outfit should rather support us and convey this to the State government. Our discussion with the Government is already over, but we want a written confirmation in this regard.

Strike to continue: Odisha Drivers' Mahasangh

Bhubaneswar (DMC): As the 'quit steering' protest by Odisha Drivers' Mahasangh entered its fourth day on Friday, the outfit president PrashantMenduli announced that member drivers will not disrupt any vehicular movement, but will continue the stir so long as their demands are not met.Reportedly, the agitation has crippled transport and fuel supply across Odisha."Many of our brothers (members of the outfit) have become worried and are reluctant to continue the sit-in. They want to get down to the roads. However, we have decided that we will peacefully continue our strike for an indefinite period," the outfit president stated. "We are not keen to indulge in any confrontation with all the political parties. Congress is a bigger organisation than us. We had previously tussled with BJD (during the Naveen-Led government) to get our demands fulfilled. Now, we are fighting for our rights with the BJP government. Hence, after the Congress chief (Bhakta Das) approached me, I agreed to his proposal and decided not to hinder their movement," Menduli said to mediapersons."We are not opposed to any of the political parties," the

22 Maoists lay down arms in Narayanpur

Raipur (HS): As many as 22 Maoists, including a divisional committee member, carrying a bounty of Rs 8 lakh on his head, surrendered in Chhattisgarh's

Narayanpur district on Friday.

According to the police, the surrendered Naxalites were active in the Abhujmadh area and carried a collective rewards of Rs 37.5 lakh. They belonged to the Kutul, Nelnar and Indravati area committees under the Maad division of the banned CPI (Maoist).

The 22 turned themselves in before senior police, Border Security Force (BSF) and Indo Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) officials.

The surrendered rebels told officials that they were disenchanted with the "hollow" Maoist ideology and growing internal differences within the banned outfit, Narayanpur Superintendent of Police Robinson Guria said.

"They were also influenced by the development work being carried out in the Maad area in the district, including rapid construction of roads, and wanted to lead a normal life," he said.

Among those who laid down arms are MankuKunjam (33), a divisional committee member, with a reward of Rs 8 lakh and three area committee members, identified as HidmeKunjam (28), PunnaLal alias Boti (26) and SaniramKorram (25) with bounties of Rs 5 lakh each, the police said.

Eleven others had a bounty of Rs 1 lakh each, while the remaining seven carried a reward of Rs 50,000 each, an official said.

Narayanpur police, its District Reserve Guard, ITBP and BSF have played a key role in their surrender. The development has caused a huge blow to the top Maoist cadres. The dream of Naxal-free Maad is now taking shape, Guria said.

All the surrendered Naxalites were provided assistance of Rs 50,000 each and would be rehabilitated as per the government's policy, he added.
