New Delhi : Prime Minister Narendra Modi extended heartfelt greetings to Samrat Choudhary upon taking the oath as the Bihar Chief Minister, succeeding Nitish Kumar.

Taking it on X, he said that Choudhary's excellence, enthusiasm, and experience will benefit the state and drive it towards development. "Heartiest congratulations and best wishes to Samrat Choudhary on taking oath as the Chief Minister of Bihar! His energy, dedication to public service, and grassroots experience will prove extremely beneficial for the state. I am fully confident that under his capable leadership, while fulfilling the aspirations of the people, Bihar will touch new heights of all-round development," he wrote.

PM Modi also congratulated Vijay Kumar Chaudhary and Bijendra

Prasad Yadav on assuming charge as the Deputy Chief Ministers of Bihar.

In another X post, the Prime Minister exuded confidence on both the Deputy CMs of Bihar, saying, "Heartiest congratulations and best wishes to Vijay Kumar Chaudhary and Bijendra Prasad Yadav on taking oath as Deputy Chief Ministers of Bihar! I am fully confident that their ground-level experience and commitment to public welfare will give a new direction and momentum to Bihar's development. Along with this, the state will establish ever-new standards of good governance, transparency, and public welfare."

Earlier in the day, Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leader Samrat Choudhary took an oath as Bihar Chief Minister.



Choudhary arrived at the Governor's residence, Bihar Lok Bhavan, earlier in the morning to be sworn in as CM, succeeding Nitish Kumar, who had served as

leader of the state for over a decade before deciding to go to the Rajya Sabha. Bihar Governor Syed Ata Hasnain administered the oath of office to Samrat Choudhary

at Lok Bhavan in Patna. He becomes the first Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) Chief Minister of Bihar following the resignation of Nitish Kumar.

The 57-year-old faces a significant challenge as he prepares to succeed Nitish Kumar, who was sworn in as Chief Minister for a record 10th time in 2025 following the NDA's historic victory in the assembly elections.

His elevation marks the end of an era dominated by Nitish Kumar's "Sushasan" (good governance) and the beginning of a new chapter for the NDA in Bihar.

Choudhary's rise to power is notable, given his humble beginnings in politics. He started his career in the 1990s with the Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) and later joined the BJP in 2018.

Senior Janata Dal (United) leader and Bihar Finance Minister Bijendra Prasad Yadav and party leader Vijay Kumar Choudhary took oaths as the Deputy Chief Ministers of Bihar.

Delhi HC allows sperm retrieval of soldier, treats prior IVF consent as valid

New Delhi: The Delhi High Court has permitted the retrieval and cryopreservation of sperm of a soldier in a persistent vegetative state, directing authorities not to deny the procedure solely due to the absence of fresh written consent.

The Court held that the soldier's prior consent to undergo In Vitro Fertilization (IVF) treatment would be treated as valid under the law. Justice Purushendra Kumar Kaurav, in an order dated April 13, 2026, further directed that the petitioner-wife's consent may be treated as sufficient for carrying forward IVF-related procedures, subject to statutory requirements and the medical condition of the soldier.

The case was filed by the wife of an Indian Army soldier who suffered a severe traumatic brain injury while on duty in Jammu and Kashmir and has since remained in a vegetative state.

The couple had earlier opted for IVF treatment to conceive a child. A medical board at Army Hospital (R&R), Delhi Cantt, informed the Court that while sperm retrieval was technically feasible, the chances of obtaining viable sperm were minimal. It also noted that the soldier lacked the capacity to provide informed consent as required under the Assisted Reproductive Technology (Regulation) Act, 2021.

Addressing this, the Court emphasised that procedural requirements cannot override fundamental rights. It held that reproductive autonomy and the right to motherhood under Article 21 must be interpreted in a manner that advances justice.

The Court further noted that the soldier had already consented to IVF treatment before the accident, and such consent could not be rendered meaningless due to his subsequent incapacity.

Relying on judicial precedents, the Delhi High Court reiterated that Indian law does not prohibit such procedures where consent can be reasonably established. It accordingly directed authorities to proceed without insisting on fresh written consent from the soldier.

Delhi launches 'safe school campaign' to boost fire safety awareness

New Delhi: Delhi Home Minister Ashish launched a city-wide fire safety awareness drive on Wednesday, including the "Safe School Campaign", aimed at strengthening safety mechanisms in schools and hospitals across the national capital.

The campaign, organised by the Education Department and the Delhi Fire Service as part of Fire Service Week, being observed from April 14 to 20, seeks to enhance public participation in promoting fire prevention and preparedness, according to a statement.

Addressing the programme virtually, Sood noted that ensuring safety is a collective responsibility and called upon citizens to actively contribute towards building a safer environment.

Under the campaign,

compliance with fire safety norms in both government and private schools will be reinforced, officials said.

Highlighting the significance of Fire Service Week, the minister paid tribute to 66 firefighters who lost their lives in a major fire incident aboard a ship in Mumbai in 1944. He said the observance serves as a reminder of the importance of fire safety and preparedness.

Referring to this year's theme focusing on safe schools, hospitals and a fire-aware society, Sood stressed that the safety of children remains a top priority. He said the Delhi Fire Service responded to over 36,000 emergency calls in the past year and is continuously upgrading its technology and training systems.

The minister also urged students to remain aware and

prepared to deal with fire-related emergencies and encouraged participation in mock drills and safety demonstrations.

More than 1,000 awareness camps have been conducted so far, training over 50,000 people in fire safety measures, the statement mentioned.

Sood advised citizens to follow basic precautions such as keeping emergency exits clear, using electrical appliances safely and contacting emergency help lines like 101 or 112 in case of fire.

He also called on school authorities to ensure proper training of staff in handling fire safety equipment.

Appealing to parents, teachers and students to remain vigilant, the minister said awareness and preparedness are key to preventing fire-related incidents.

Centre asked to clarify position on transgender identity in official records: Delhi HC

New Delhi : The Delhi High Court has sought a detailed response from the Union of India on issues concerning the recognition and recording of transgender persons in educational and official documents, observing that the outcome of the case could have far-reaching implications across multiple government records.

A Division Bench of Justice Prathiba M. Singh and Justice Madhu Jain, while hearing a batch of petitions, directed that the Secretary of the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment (MoSJE) be impleaded as a respondent and asked the Centre to file its stand by way of an affidavit within six weeks.

The Court noted that the petitions raise

During the hearing, counsel for CBSE referred to the Transgender Persons (Protection of Rights) Amendment Act, 2026, highlighting changes in the statutory definition of a "transgender person." However, the petitioners argued that the amendment is yet to be notified and submitted that they would fall within the amended definition in any case.


questions regarding how transgender persons are identified in certificates issued by institutions such as the University of Delhi and the CBSE.

It further observed that any directions passed in the matter may also affect other official documentation, including birth and death

certificates, passports, Aadhaar cards and driving licences.

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Taking note of the broader ramifications, the Court permitted the Centre to consult other ministries, if required, to assist in framing comprehensive directions. It also directed parties to file written submissions addressing the effect of the amendment before the next date of hearing on July 15, 2026.

He highlighted that the museum has been developed through the joint efforts of the state's Culture and Tourism Department, district administration, and Indian National Trust for Art and Cultural Heritage. It showcases rare photographs, artworks, and exhibits reflecting Sambalpur's history, culture, and traditions, along with depictions of eminent freedom fighters and local heroes.

Pradhan noted that, according to the Archaeological Survey of India, Sambalpur's history dates back over 10,000 years, as

evidenced by ancient cave paintings and rock art. He also mentioned the cultural significance of the region, including the revered Samaleswari Temple and the Mahanadi river basin.

Emphasizing education, he said that through the National Education Policy, efforts are being made to bring the stories of regional freedom fighters to a national platform. He invited students and youth to visit the museum and connect with their roots.

Water Crisis Hits Makidia Community: 105 Families Struggle in Anand Nagar.

Sambalpur-15/04(DMS) While some regions face electricity shortages and others struggle with access to education, residents of Anand Nagar village in Jamankira block are battling a severe drinking water crisis. Despite its name suggesting happiness, life in the village is extremely difficult.

Anand Nagar, located under Kulundi Panchayat (Ward No. 16), is home to over 105 families belonging to the Makidia tribal community, with a population of more than 400 people. Locally known as "Makidiapada," the village lies just about 100 meters from Kadlupal Chhak along National Highway No. 53.

Even though there are four tube wells in the village, they are insufficient to meet the needs of the population. Villagers say the available water sources cannot provide adequate drinking water. As a result, residents depend on a nearby stream located between Kadlupal Chhak and Haldibahal road for their daily needs such as bathing and sanitation.

However, the condition of the stream has worsened. The water has become polluted with fallen leaves, turned black in color, and emits a foul smell. Villagers fear that using this contaminated water may lead to various skin diseases.

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According to locals, the stream usually dries up by February. This year, a small check dam has helped retain water for a few more days. But once it dries up, residents will be forced to cross National Highway 53 and travel nearly 2 kilometers to Kadlupal Kata to fetch water. This poses serious

risks, especially for women and children.

Villagers including Samari Hembram, Sunita Khadia, Sarojini Khadia, Shanti Munda, Umlan Kandolana, and others have demanded the construction of a permanent water source for basic needs like bathing and sanitation. They have urged the

Panchayat and block administration to take immediate action. What raises concern is that despite frequent movement of officials, leaders, and ministers along the nearby highway, the plight of Anand Nagar remains largely ignored. The villagers hope for urgent intervention, especially since the area falls under the constituency of Rural Development, Panchayati Raj, and Drinking Water Minister Rabinarayan Naik. The ongoing water crisis in this tribal village highlights a serious gap in basic infrastructure and calls for immediate government attention.

Angul: Chhendipada Naini Mines (SCCL) faces difficulty despite all agreements and clearances from State Govt

The Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL), a Government coal company jointly owned by Telangana and the Government of India, was allotted the 10-million-tonne Naini Coal Mine in Chhendipada, Angul district, in 2015 to meet the fuel needs of its 1200 MW thermal power plant. SCCL, which operates 39 mines and contributes nearly 9% of India's domestic coal supply, has since completed all statutory formalities and invested heavily to operationalize the Naini project.

The Naini block lies in a greenfield zone of the Talcher coalfields, an area that currently lacks railway connectivity and a dedicated coal corridor. To

address this, a 68-km common rail line was planned by Mahanadi Coal Railway Ltd. (MCRL), a joint venture of MCL, IRCON and IDCO. However, after completing only 14 km of the Angul-Balaram stretch, the project stalled and the JV entered liquidation, leaving the remaining 48 km unfinished.

Pending the railway line, SCCL proposed to transport coal via the existing Chhendipada-Jarapada ODR road, as permitted in the approved Mining Plan and Environmental Clearance. Responding to SCCL's request, the district administration proposed strengthening the road



and constructing bypasses in three villages. SCCL deposited ₹35.23 crore in December 2021 as its share of the cost, but the road work has not progressed.

Meanwhile, villagers along the route—including Tentuloi, Balipata, Durgapur, Kosala and Jarapada—have been protesting against coal-laden truck

movement, citing safety hazards and pollution. Their resistance has blocked coal evacuation from the mine, despite police deployment by the District Administration. Ministry of coal, considering the logistic issues permitted to sell coal through auction route to power plants. Meenakshi Energy Limited, Jindal India power limited, Jindal steel and power limited and GMR Kamalanga collectively secured 17.60 Lakh ton of coal for offtake from the pit head of the mine. Meenakshi Energy Ltd planned for coal transportation under R-C-R mode utilising SH-63 road and Hindol Road and Kamakhyanager sidings but

transportation again faced road blockades by the resident of Kosala leaving trucks stranded for weeks.

Mining operations at Naini began on 1 May 2025, but due to evacuation issues and continuous local opposition nearly 80,000 tonnes of coal remain stocked at the mine, and operations had to be halted from 1 March 2026.

SCCL has already invested over ₹800 crore in grounding the project—more than ₹400 crore paid to the State Forest Department towards NPV, Compensatory Afforestation and statutory levies, and over ₹350 crore for private land acquisition and EC compliances. The company has also spent ₹4-5 crore

on CSR works such as drinking water, roads and solar lighting, and around ₹6.5 crore on large-scale plantation activities in partnership with the Forest Department.

Despite full compliance, clearances and substantial investment, SCCL remains unable to dispatch coal from the Naini mine. The continued blockade is causing heavy financial losses to the company and significant revenue loss to the State Exchequer of around Rs 1500 cr per annum through forgone royalty, DMF, reserve price and GST. The situation is also affecting coal availability for power plants, making it critical for both industry and the State.

RDC-Level Probe Ordered into Death of Mayurbhanj Ashram School Student

Bhubaneswar, 15 April (H.S.): Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi has ordered a Revenue Divisional Commissioner (RDC)-level inquiry into the death of Rupali Beshra, a Class V student of an Ashram School in Rasgovindpur area of Mayurbhanj district.

Rupali, daughter of Durga Beshra from Rasagobindapur tehsil, reportedly died due to suspected food poisoning at the school hostel. Several other students also fell ill

following the incident, raising serious concerns over food safety and hygiene at the residential institution.

The RDC of the Central Division has been directed to visit the spot on the morning of April 16 and conduct a comprehensive inquiry into the circumstances leading to the student's death and the sudden illness of others.

Expressing deep grief over the tragic incident, the Chief Minister conveyed his condolences to the bereaved family. He also announced an

ex-gratia assistance of ₹3 lakh from the Chief Minister's Relief Fund (CMRF) to the next of kin of the deceased.

Meanwhile, two medical teams have been mobilised to assess the health condition of the affected students. One team, comprising the Joint Director of the Integrated Disease Surveillance Programme (IDSP) and a microbiologist, is already stationed in Baripada, while another team is scheduled to reach Rasgovindpur on Wednesday for further investigation and medical support.

WB Election

THE clock is ticking for lakhs of people whose appeals against the deletion of their names from West Bengal's electoral rolls are pending in appellate tribunals. The Supreme Court has refused to issue directions allowing aggrieved residents to vote, saying that their petition is "premature" and they must exhaust their remedies before the appellate authorities. The tribunals have their work cut out as two-phase polling will be held in the state on April 23 and 29.

From the outset, the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls in the state has been marked by a bitter confrontation between the ruling Trinamool Congress (TMC) and the Election Commission of India (ECI). The entire exercise has been under judicial scrutiny over the past few months amid allegations of "politically motivated" deletions of voters' names. The onus is on the tribunals to expedite the adjudication process. Even though many claims have already been dealt with, the scale of omissions and the anxiety among affected voters cannot be dismissed lightly. The right to vote, as the apex court noted, is not merely constitutional but deeply "sentimental"—a marker of belonging and citizenship. When individuals fear disenfranchisement or, worse, detention, the issue transcends procedural technicalities. Transparency in deletions and swift disposal of appeals are essential to ensure that no eligible voter is left out.

Making matters worse, the Centre-State conflict has not remained confined to the SIR row. The arrest of Vinesh Chandel, co-founder of the Indian Political Action Committee (I-PAC)—a consultancy firm working for the TMC—by the Enforcement Directorate in a money-laundering case has emerged as a new flashpoint. With political tensions mounting by the day, free and fair polls in Bengal hinge on the credibility of Central institutions and the cooperation of the state authorities.

Delhi-Dehradun

THE inauguration of the Delhi-Dehradun Expressway marks a significant milestone in India's infrastructure journey, promising to compress travel time between the national capital and Uttarakhand's gateway city to under three hours. More than a feat of engineering, the project signals a shift in how highways are imagined. They are not merely roads, but also economic corridors linking regions, markets and opportunities. At one level, the benefits are immediate and tangible. Faster connectivity is expected to boost tourism to Dehradun and Mussoorie, ease congestion on existing routes and stimulate economic activity across western Uttar Pradesh. Districts like Saharanpur and Shamli, often bypassed in earlier development cycles, could see gains in logistics, warehousing and real estate. In that sense, the expressway fits squarely within the Centre's broader push for integrated, high-speed corridors under programmes like Bharatmala.

What sets this project apart is its attempt to reconcile development with ecological sensitivity. The elevated wildlife corridor through the Rajaji landscape, complete with animal underpasses, reflects a growing recognition that infrastructure must adapt to nature, not the other way around. Karnataka's elephant corridors, linking Bandipur, Nagarhole and adjoining forests, similarly show how connectivity safeguards migration routes while reducing human-wildlife conflict. If effective over time, the new expressway could become a model for future projects in ecologically fragile zones.

However, concerns remain. Reports of last-minute construction fixes and earlier delays raise familiar questions about the quality of execution and the pressure of deadlines. Infrastructure must be judged not by inauguration timelines but by durability, safety and long-term environmental impact. Ultimately, the expressway embodies both promise and caution. It showcases India's ambition to build faster and smarter, but also underscores the need for rigorous standards and accountability. The true success of this project will lie in whether it sustains efficiency without compromising ecological and structural integrity.



West Asia in Turmoil: Fragile Diplomacy

The ongoing conflict in West Asia has once again exposed the fragility of regional stability and the complexities of global diplomacy. The war involving Iran, the United States, and Israel has escalated into a wider geopolitical crisis with far-reaching implications for energy security, global trade, and international relations. The recent U.S.-Iran talks in Islamabad, following a temporary ceasefire, were driven by the strategic importance of the Strait of Hormuz, which Iran had closed. This episode highlights shifting power dynamics in the region. At the same time, India, which currently chairs BRICS, chose to maintain silence on the West Asia crisis, raising concerns about its global standing.

The question remains: why did the talks fail? The 21-hour marathon negotiations between Iran and the United States, mediated by Pakistan, ended inconclusively without any concrete breakthrough. The deadlock centred around three core demands from Iran.

First, Tehran rejected the U.S. insistence on dismantling its nuclear programme and surrendering uranium enrichment capabilities, asserting that its

nuclear activities are strictly for civilian purposes and fall within its sovereign rights.

Second, Iran demanded control over the Strait of Hormuz, including the authority to levy transit fees on ships passing through this critical waterway. This was firmly opposed by the United States, which argued that such control would violate the principle of free navigation and disrupt global shipping.

Third, Iran sought a comprehensive regional ceasefire, including an end to Israeli strikes on Hezbollah in Lebanon. Additional demands—such as war reparations and broader security assurances—were also rejected. Analysts attribute the failure of the talks to a deep trust deficit, domestic political compulsions, and Israel's strategic considerations. U.S. Vice President J.D. Vance termed the outcome a failure, though Iranian officials indicated that diplomatic channels remain open. Meanwhile, President Donald Trump's threat of a naval blockade of the Strait of Hormuz further escalated tensions.

The 40-day conflict witnessed intense military engagement between Iran and the U.S.-Israel axis before a fragile two-week ceasefire was

announced. Iran's broader demands—including sanctions relief, withdrawal of U.S. forces, release of frozen assets, and cessation of hostilities in Lebanon—reflect its attempt to reshape West Asian geopolitics.

At the heart of West Asian politics lies the Strait of Hormuz, a critical maritime chokepoint through which nearly 17 million barrels of oil pass daily, along with LNG and fertilisers. Its strategic importance extends beyond energy to global trade, with thousands of vessels carrying essential commodities such as food, medicines, and industrial goods passing through it every month.

Iran's ability to disrupt this route underscores its strategic leverage. The closure of the strait, coupled with the imposition of transit tolls, has far-reaching consequences for global energy prices and supply chains.

The conflict has also reinforced the dynamics of a war-driven global economy. A recent SIPRI report estimated that the United States spent around \$10,300 every second on air strikes against Iran, amounting to approximately ₹8,455 crore per day, including costs related to air operations, munitions, naval deployment, missile defence,

intelligence, and logistics.

Iran's resilience and defiance against joint U.S.-Israel pressure have elevated its stature in the region, projecting it as a dominant power among Islamic nations. At the same time, its missile attacks caused significant damage to oil refineries, infrastructure, and U.S. military bases in Gulf countries, exposing the limitations of American security assurances. Analysts suggest that such developments may prompt Gulf nations to reconfigure their strategic alignments in the future.

However, the most striking aspect of this crisis is India's muted response. As the world's fourth-largest economy and largest democracy, with substantial stakes in West Asia—from energy security to the welfare of its diaspora—India was expected to play a constructive and proactive diplomatic role. Instead, its silence raises concerns about a dilution of its long-standing commitment to strategic autonomy and balanced diplomacy.

In contrast, Pakistan, despite its internal challenges, seized the opportunity by positioning itself as a mediator in the U.S.-Iran talks. It enhanced diplomatic visibility and earned recognition from other nations. During the conflict, Pakistan also remained in contact

with China, which holds considerable influence over Iran, while Russia continues to be a longstanding strategic partner of Tehran.

India's reluctance to initiate or lead meaningful peace efforts risks diminishing its strategic relevance in the region. A civilisational nation that once championed non-alignment, dialogue, and peace now appears to be a passive observer in a crisis where it has significant stakes. In a rapidly evolving geopolitical landscape, silence is not neutrality—it is marginalisation.

The West Asian crisis highlights that enduring conflicts cannot be resolved through military means. They require sustained diplomatic engagement and credible mediation. While global and regional powers continue to negotiate and assert influence, India's absence from the diplomatic arena is increasingly conspicuous. India has long upheld the principle of "Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam"—the world is one family. If it aspires to be a leading global power, it must move beyond cautious detachment and actively engage in conflict resolution. Otherwise, it risks being sidelined in the evolving global order.

Biju Patnaik: a Legendary Hero

A giant transference of energy had taken place between him and his people. He delighted the people by his youthfulness of spirit and body and the people were attracted to his spontaneity and utter freedom from pomposity. In the end, his great strength far outweighed his weakness. Therefore when he died, even his most partisan adversaries felt compelled to acknowledge the immensity of the man they had opposed.

Perhaps no other leader occupied the imagination of the people of Orissa like Biju Patnaik; freedom fighter, pilot, industrialist, politician and philanthropist. He was Orissa's restless son and became a legendary hero. His ability to create confidence among people and inspire them was phenomenal. He had a remarkable capacity to transmit his cheerful strength to others. Biju was basically a secular man and was an instinctively nationalist as his hero Napoleon. Like Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, he navigated by the four immutably fixed stars of his convictions—national unity, democracy, secularism and the end of imperialism. Sir Julian Huxley,

UNESCO'S First Director General and also a Kalinga Prize Winner, had described Biju Patnaik as a "remarkable Indian whose adventures would fill a book".

Biju Babu was the first Indian leader who took bold steps towards grassroots level democracy and women's participation in Panchayati Raj system. He believed in the Gandhian ideal of Panchayati Raj as the bulwark of Indian democracy and made sincere efforts to bring it to life. He described every Sarpanch as the Chief Minister of his Panchayat. His policy had been to progressively delegate more and more functions and to fully assist the three-tier system of administration to develop into effective popular institutions for implementation of various developmental works, schemes and programs. As the then Chief Minister, he stated in 1961, "This is a movement of building up leaders of men from the lowest rung of our society and it is not going to be easy. It is almost a people's movement; we are only trying to give some hope, some other direction or some authorities. But the movement can only succeed if we give that authority to the people right from bottom of our social ladder who can exercise



effective leadership. It is a big question and we have in this house got to think with a far greater sympathy and prospective looking at distant future and planning from now how you want the future to be built."

Tales and anecdotes about him are a legion. There is a story that Pt. Nehru once asked Dr.B.C. Roy—'Have you met a man called Biju Patnaik?'. 'I have heard about him; but not yet met him', was the reply of the Bengal Chief Minister. Nehru said, "meet him sometimes.

I like such forward-looking, brave people. The only difficulty is that sometimes you don't know where he will land you".

A long, illustrious career came to an end on 17th April, 1997 when Biju Patnaik passed away at Delhi. His death was one of the worst tragedies that had ever happened to the State of Orissa and removed the greatest figure of our time at the very climax of his career. Grief and shock swept across Orissa as news of his death spread. It was perhaps a tryst with destiny that Patnaik

was cremated at Swargadwara, Puri. He was to rest in peace close to the abode of his Kalia (Lord Jagannath). Though he was not religious in the traditional sense, he had a sentimental attachment to Lord Jagannath. While addressing public meeting in front of the Puri Jagannath Temple, he used to enter into a monologue with the Lord.

Adventure indeed! It is in his blood from body hood. It is this love of adventure that goaded him to have a bicycle ride from Cuttack to Peshawar when he was a student and to change his profession of an aeronautical engineer to that of a pilot. It is this call of adventure that inspired him to undertake the risky jobs of flying the stranded Britishers in Burma to safety during the Second World War days and to carry on at the same time anti-British subversive activities which ultimately landed him into jail. In providing indispensable leadership, he emerged as the greatest political figure of his age. The story of his adventurous life still inspires the youth of Orissa.

Amazing from Garbage: Plastic will make water and soil pure

In fact, after an FIR was registered in Assam, the Assam Police conducted a raid on 7 April at Pawan Kheda's residence in Delhi, but he was not found at his residence at that time.

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Kejriwal Files Affidavit on New Allegations Against Justice Swarnkanta Sharma

New Delhi, 15/4 (H.S.): Former Chief Minister of Delhi, Arvind Kejriwal, has filed an affidavit in court on April 13 while personally presenting arguments, leveling allegations against Justice Swarnkanta Sharma of the Delhi High Court. In the affidavit filed on Wednesday in the Delhi High Court, he has reiterated accusations against Justice Swarnkanta Sharma and demanded her recusal from the hearing. In the affidavit, Kejriwal stated that both children of Justice Swarnkanta Sharma work under Solicitor General Tushar Mehta. Tushar Mehta assigns cases to his children. The affidavit submitted by Kejriwal states that Solicitor General Tushar Mehta represents the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) in this matter. In such circumstances, how can Justice Swarnkanta Sharma issue orders against Tushar Mehta? Prior to this, on April 13, Arvind

Kejriwal had personally presented arguments, raising questions on Justice Swarnkanta Sharma's bench and demanding her recusal from the hearing. While demanding that Justice Swarnkanta Sharma recuse herself from hearing the case, Kejriwal stated that the manner in which judicial proceedings have unfolded thus far offers no hope of impartial justice. Kejriwal's application included 10 such arguments that also cast doubts on the functioning of investigative agencies and the judicial process. Expressing distrust in Justice Swarnkanta Sharma, Kejriwal stated that she had deemed the sessions court order incorrect without hearing the opposing side. He remarked that during the first hearing in the High Court on March 9, not a single accused out of 23 was present. Only the CBI was present in court, yet Justice Swarnkanta

Sharma declared in the very first hearing, without hearing the other side's arguments, that 'prima facie,' the sessions court order appeared incorrect. Without summoning the records and without hearing arguments, how did the court arrive at this conclusion? Kejriwal stated that a stay was imposed on the Enforcement Directorate (ED) proceedings without any application. He said that the hearing on April 9 pertained to the CBI's appeal, but Justice Sharma also imposed a stay on the ED proceedings. According to the accused, neither the Central Government nor the ED had made any such prayer. Legally, if the main case's offense is not proven, the ED's case weakens automatically. The sessions court had concluded the CBI case, which would have ended the ED case as well, but Justice Sharma imposed a stay on her own initiative.

Bangladesh's Last Lifeline Falter: Eastern Refinery Grinds to Halt Over Crude Crunch

Dhaka, 15/4 (H.S.): Bangladesh's sole state-owned oil refinery, Eastern Refinery Limited, in Chittagong (now Chattogram) has been forced to halt production due to a shortage of crude oil. The two main processing units at the refinery were shut down on Tuesday afternoon, while the third unit continues to operate at partial capacity, producing only small quantities of petrol and octane. The Energy and Mineral Resources

Division's spokesperson, Monir Hossain Chowdhury, confirmed the suspension. No refinery official was willing to comment on the situation. According to Dhaka Tribune sources, the crisis stems from a shortfall in crude-oil supply, compounded by supply-chain disruptions related to the ongoing conflict in West Asia. A shipment of crude remains stuck in Saudi Arabia, causing inventories to dwindle since the beginning of the month. The refinery had been operating on alternative measures



since 5 April. Eastern Refinery typically processes about 4,500 tonnes of crude oil daily, yielding around 13 refined-fuel products, including octane, petrol, diesel, and furnace oil. Because of the crude shortage, output has already dropped to roughly 3,500 tonnes per day over the past

month. The current instability, fuelled by the U.S.-Israel-Iran conflict, has halted crude imports for nearly two months. The next shipment is expected to arrive in the first week of May. The refinery has a crude-oil storage capacity of about 150,000 tonnes and can store up to 250,000 tonnes of refined

fuel. The government insists that no immediate fuel shortage is expected even with the refinery shut down, as the country holds sufficient reserves of refined petroleum products. In fact, since the conflict began, authorities have purchased these products at higher prices to maintain stock levels.

First Round of Lebanon-Israel Talks Concludes in Washington, No Immediate Truce but Dialogue Opens Door

Washington, 15/4 (H.S.): The first round of direct US-mediated negotiations between Israel and Lebanon has concluded. The talks, held after roughly three decades of no direct contact, are being seen as an important step toward restoring regional peace, though no concrete agreement on a ceasefire has yet been reached. Israeli Ambassador to the United States, Yechiel Leiter, described his two-hour meeting with Lebanon's envoy, Nada Hamadeh, as "highly positive." He said several key proposals and ideas had been discussed and would now be presented to their respective governments. However, on the issue of a ceasefire, Israel has adopted a firm stance and refused to commit to any binding pause in hostilities. Leiter stressed that the priority remained the security of Israeli civilians and that military operations would



continue as long as attacks from across the border persisted. He described Hezbollah as weakened but added that Israel would not compromise on its security. At the same time, he did not rule out the possibility of improved and more formal relations between Lebanon and Israel in the future. According to Lebanon's state-run agency, the negotiations are an initial attempt

to reduce rising tensions along the border and move toward a lasting settlement. Both sides may meet again for further talks in the coming weeks. Even though the first round has not produced an immediate ceasefire, the restoration of dialogue itself is considered a positive signal, one that could pave the way for a more substantive peace process in the months ahead.

Tropical Cyclone Maila Kills 23 In Papua New Guinea

Melbourne: Authorities said on Wednesday that 12 more people have died after eastern Papua New Guinea (PNG) was hit by Severe Tropical Cyclone Maila, taking the total reported death toll to 23. Jelta Wong, the Member of Parliament for the Gazelle District in PNG's East New Britain Province, told The National newspaper that 10 people died when they were buried by a landslide in the remote Lamarain village on Sunday. He said that all 10 bodies were successfully recovered and described the loss as a "profound sorrow" for the community, reports Xinhua news agency. The landslide was caused by continuous heavy rainfall brought by Severe Tropical Cyclone, which hit eastern PNG over the weekend, causing widespread damage. Randal Ganisi, the disaster coordinator in



the Milne Bay Province, told The National that two deaths have been reported in the region. He said that teams have been deployed to island communities to assess how many people have been displaced and the extent of damage. It comes

after 11 deaths were reported on Monday in the autonomous Bougainville region, including eight who were killed in a landslide. PNG's state-owned National Broadcasting Corporation on Tuesday reported that a state of

emergency has been declared for the entire Bougainville region amid widespread destruction of infrastructure, mass displacement of communities and an escalating humanitarian crisis caused by the cyclone. Meanwhile, three people have been reported missing in the Solomon Islands. Australia's Bureau of Meteorology said that Tropical Cyclone Maila was a Category 5 storm in the Solomon Sea on Tuesday. The Solomon Islands Broadcasting Corporation reported that three people have been reported missing following severe weather from the cyclone in Choiseul Province, which neighbours Western Province to the north. The Royal Solomon Islands Police Force said that it has activated operations centres in Western and Choiseul provinces and urged all members of the public to take necessary precautions.

Pakistan Reactivates 70 Terror Launchpads In PoK, 800 Terrorists Ready For Infiltration

New Delhi, 15/4 (H.S.): Pakistan's Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI) and its army have reactivated at least 70 terror launchpads across the Line of Control and International Border, planning a mass infiltration of nearly 800 terrorists into Jammu and Kashmir, intelligence sources revealed on Wednesday. The Pakistan establishment aims to exploit the current global focus on the Middle East conflict and the ongoing state elections in India to facilitate the infiltration, an official said. Global attention has largely been centred on developments in the Middle East following the conflict between the US, Israel, and Iran. Even as Pakistan attempted to facilitate talks between the US and Iran, which failed, its Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI), along with the army, has directed the reactivation of terror launchpads in Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK). Amid these global developments and the ongoing assembly elections in various states in India, the Pakistan establishment is believed to be seeking an opportunity to step up infiltration efforts, an official said. The numbers have been rising steadily, with several terrorists being moved into Pakistan-occupied Kashmir and kept ready on the launchpads for infiltration into Jammu and Kashmir. Intelligence inputs indicate that at least 70 launchpads are active across the border, including around 10 along



the International Border and the rest along the Line of Control (LoC). Estimates suggest that nearly 800 terrorists are currently waiting for an opportunity to infiltrate. An official from the Intelligence Bureau said that the infiltration strategy has been revised after several attempts to enter Jammu and Kashmir in recent months were foiled due to heightened vigilance by security forces along the borders. "The plan now is to attempt coordinated infiltrations from multiple entry points to stretch security forces. Groups of 10 to 15 terrorists may be pushed in simultaneously, with the expectation that at least a few will manage to get through," the official said. He added that Pakistan is seeking to take advantage of ongoing developments in India and abroad, in the hope that any

operational gap could be used to facilitate infiltration. A sense of urgency has reportedly set in after Operation Sindoor in May last year, in which Indian armed forces targeted and destroyed terror infrastructure in Pakistan and PoK. The operation was carried out in response to the Pahalgam attack in April last year that left 26 Indian tourists dead. Since then, Indian forces and security agencies have thwarted multiple infiltration attempts. Sources indicate that Pakistan's ISI and the army are facing pressure from terrorist groups such as Lashkar-e-Taiba over the lack of operational activity in Jammu and Kashmir. Officials said Jammu and Kashmir remains central to the functioning of these groups, making continued unrest a key objective for the Pakistan establishment, particularly in the context of local dynamics

Oil, Stocks Steady Despite Iran Crisis: Trump

Washington: US President Donald Trump has said the American economy remains resilient despite the ongoing conflict with Iran, asserting that oil prices and stock markets have held up better than expected during the crisis. In an interview with Fox News at the White House, Trump pointed to stable energy prices even as tensions escalated in the Gulf. "If you told me that we were gonna be at only 92 a barrel... I would've been very surprised," he said, noting that many had predicted a surge to \$200 per barrel. He expressed confidence that prices would fall sharply once the conflict ends. "Gasoline's coming down very soon and very big," Trump said, adding that energy costs would ease across the board.

The President acknowledged short-term disruption but downplayed longer-term risks to growth. "There's a hit because...



we go through it for whatever it is, six weeks. There's gonna be a hit, but it's gonna recover," he said. Trump also highlighted the relative stability of US financial markets, despite volatility earlier in the year. "If you told me that in the midst of it... we'd have a stock market that's almost as good as it was two months ago...

I think we're doing very well," he said. Looking ahead, he predicted a strong rebound once hostilities subside. "When this is over, I think the stock market is gonna boom," Trump said. The President tied economic performance to his broader geopolitical strategy, arguing that military action was necessary to prevent a larger

crisis. He warned that allowing Iran to develop nuclear weapons would have far more severe economic consequences. On domestic policy, Trump pointed to tax changes under his administration as cushioning households from rising costs. "People are getting refunds of 5,000, 8,000, \$11,000 that they had no idea they were getting," he said. He also maintained that energy costs would remain a central factor in economic stability. "It fuels sort of everything... it fuels the economy," Trump said, linking lower oil prices to broader economic gains. The comments come as global markets remain sensitive to developments in the Strait of Hormuz, through which a significant share of the world's oil supply passes. Any disruption in the region has immediate implications for global energy prices and inflation trends.

Ambedkar's Constitutional Morality Can Strengthen Multilateralism In Fragmented World: P Harish

New York: B.R. Ambedkar's concept of constitutional morality can strengthen multilateralism in a world beset by conflicts and political fragmentation, according to India's Permanent Representative P. Harish. Speaking at the Ambedkar Jayanti observance here on Tuesday, he said that the Indian Constitution's architect's vision of morality and law, when applied to multilateralism, can help in reforming the UN and revitalise it. The Jayanti observed here on the 135th birth anniversary of Ambedkar was marked by a

discussion of "Dr B R Ambedkar's Vision of Constitutional Morality and its Relevance for Multilateralism". Raja Sekhar Vundru, a scholar of Ambedkar's work, said that having lived through two world wars and seeing the creation of the UN, he recognised the importance of multilateralism. Vundru, who is an additional chief secretary of the Haryana government, is the author of "Ambedkar, Gandhi and Patel: The Making of India's Electoral System." He said that the Indian constitution that Ambedkar drafted reflects the spirit of the UN's Charter in striving

for peace. Ambedkar's ideas of constitutional morality can promote multilateralism and adherence to the UN Charter. Santosh Raut, a visiting professor at Harvard Divinity School, said that Ambedkar viewed the Constitution as a vehicle for social justice and economic transformation, ideas that have relevance to the UN's goals in these areas. Morality is the force that enables the implementation of the spirit of written texts like the UN Charter and Ambedkar had foreseen it, said the scholar of Buddhism.

Pakistan: Poor Medical Care Reason Behind Imran Khan's Deteriorating Health, Alleges PTI

Islamabad: The Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) has once again raised concerns over the health condition of its founder and former Prime Minister Imran Khan, his wife Bushra Bibi and senior party leader Ejaz Chaudhry, blaming neglect and restricted access to healthcare for their deteriorating medical condition.

The PTI stated that prolonged detention and restrictions to access medical facilities have worsened the issues faced by its leaders, causing serious complications in each case. Reportedly, Imran Khan and Bushra Bibi are suffering from serious eye ailments while Chaudhry's kidney disease has progressed to third stage. The party has called for shifting Imran Khan, his wife and Chaudhry to proper medical facilities and getting them treated by personal physicians so that they may be treated with more vigilance and care, an editorial in leading

Pakistani daily Dawn mentioned. According to the newspaper, the demands raised by the party are not unreasonable and the authorities must try to agree to them. It should not lead to something untoward happening to these lawmakers, including cancer survivor Yasmin Rashid, while they fully rely on the government for their well-being. "Regardless of whether one supports the PTI narrative of political persecution or the government's insistence on due process and the letter of the law, the health and well-being of prisoners must not be turned into a matter of contention," Dawn mentioned. "There is no extra 'justice' that can be extracted by subjecting an individual already deprived of their civil liberties to prolonged solitary confinement, or restricting their access to family and personal physicians, or delaying shifting seriously ill prisoners to proper medical

facilities. Such actions merely erode public trust in the entire system by sending the signal that the country's administrative and judicial mechanisms are operating well short of the minimum standards expected of a civilised state," it added. Last month, Imran Khan's son, Kasim, termed his father's detention "arbitrary" and raised serious concerns over treatment by the Pakistani authorities which he said breaches international human rights conventions. During the United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) session in Geneva, Kasim Khan said that Imran Khan's case was not an "isolated incident" but it was the "most visible example" of a much wider pattern of repression in Pakistan since 2022. He spoke about the detention of political prisoners, trial and conviction of civilians by military courts and journalists being "silenced, abducted or driven into exile," Dawn reported.

Sensex and Nifty Surge in Early Trade Amid Trump's Iran Dialogue Optimism

New Delhi, 15/4(H.S.): Buoyed by US President Donald Trump's signal to resume talks with Iran to resolve the West Asia crisis, domestic stock markets mirrored global exuberance today, opening with robust gains. Trading commenced on a strong note, though profit-booking post-opening induced a mild dip in both Sensex and Nifty indices. Nevertheless, the market sustained vigorous upward momentum. After the first hour of trading, Sensex advanced 1.71 percent, while Nifty climbed 1.67 percent. Among heavyweight stocks post-initial hour, InterGlobe Aviation, HDFC Life, Max Healthcare, Larsen & Toubro, and TCS traded with gains ranging from 4.60 percent to 3.07 percent. Conversely, Dr. Reddy's Laboratories, ONGC, Coal India, and ICICI Bank operated with declines between 1.38 percent and 0.21 percent. Up to this juncture, active trading encompassed 2,829 stocks, of which 2,639 advanced in green territory, while 190 declined in red. Of the 30 Sensex



constituents, 29 traded in green buoyed by buying support, with only one under selling pressure in red. Among Nifty's 50 stocks, 46 remained green, and four red. BSE's Sensex opened 1,133.53 points higher at 77,981.10. It swiftly surged to 78,270.42, before profit-taking pulled it to 77,849.52. Renewed buying then propelled it upward; by 10:15 a.m., after the first hour amid sustained buy-sell

activity, Sensex traded 1,313.62 points up at 78,161.19. Mirroring Sensex, NSE's Nifty debuted 321.15 points higher at 24,163.80, peaking over 115 points above opening at 24,280.90, then slipping to 24,145.80 on profit-taking. Fresh buying revived its ascent; by 10:15 a.m., post-initial hour amid ongoing transactions, Nifty advanced 397.65 points to 24,240.30. The previous trading day, Monday,

Global and Asian Markets Rally on Hopes of Renewed US-Iran Talks



New Delhi, 15/4 (H.S.): Amid expectations of a swift resolution to the ongoing West Asia tensions, a buoyant atmosphere pervades global markets. US markets closed higher in the previous session, with Dow Jones futures trading in positive territory today. European markets witnessed sustained buying throughout the last session, while Asian markets display widespread strength. Signals of resuming dialogue with Iran sustained exuberance in US markets during the prior session. The Dow Jones leaped up to 600 points. Similarly, the S&P 500 Index concluded trading 81.14 points or 1.18 percent higher at 6,967.38. Additionally, Nasdaq closed 455.35 points or 1.96 percent up at 23,639.08. Dow Jones futures currently trade 80.74 points or

0.17 percent higher at 48,616.73. Echoing US markets, European bourses maintained vigor in the previous session. The FTSE Index closed at 10,609.06, up 0.25 percent. The CAC Index ended 91.88 points or 1.10 percent higher at 8,327.86. The DAX Index finished 301.78 points or 1.26 percent up at 24,044.22. Asian markets also exhibit broad-based gains today. Eight out of nine Asian indices traded in green. Thailand's Stock Exchange remains closed, so SET Composite shows no movement. Gift Nifty trades 335 points or 1.40 percent higher at 24,212.50. Likewise, Hang Seng Index has reached 26,136, up 263.68 points or 1.01 percent. Kospi Index registers a sharp surge, currently at 6,148.67, up 180.92 points or 3.03 percent.

Markets Soar on West Asia Peace Hopes: Sensex and Nifty Record Strong Gains, Investors Gain 9.11 Lakh Crore

New Delhi, 15 April (H.S.): Domestic stock markets once again showed very strong strength today. Today's trading opened on a positive note with both major indices advancing from the first bell. Although the market witnessed intermittent profit-booking during the session, the underlying strength of both the Sensex and the Nifty remained intact throughout the day. Despite temporary bouts of selling pressure triggered by profit-booking, the Sensex continued to trade with a robust positive bias of over 1,000 points. Likewise, the Nifty also held a steady upside of more than 300 points. After the end of the full trading session, the Sensex closed 1.64 per cent higher and the Nifty ended 1.63 per cent up. Market sentiment improved sharply today on the hope that peace talks between the United States and Iran may resume in West Asia. As a result, global crude oil prices softened, while the Indian rupee strengthened against the dollar. These factors combined to sustain a bullish mood in the markets all day, which helped the Sensex and the Nifty to close with strong gains. Across the board, all sectoral indices traded in the green today. Heavy buying in stocks of the IT, capital goods, consumer durables, oil and gas, public sector enterprises, infrastructure, realty,



and media sectors pushed their respective indices higher by more than around two per cent. In addition, the banking, automobile, FMCG, healthcare, metals, and technology indices also closed more than one per cent higher. Even in the broader market, buying remained persistent, with the Nifty Midcap Index closing up 2.20 per cent and the Nifty Smallcap Index surging 2.35 per cent, reflecting strong risk appetite among investors. The sharp strength in the equity market today translated into a substantial wealth gain for

investors, with their total portfolio value rising by over 99 lakh crore. After today's session, the combined market capitalisation of BSE-listed companies climbed to 7458.25 lakh crore (provisional), up from 7449.14 lakh crore at the end of the previous trading session, which effectively added about 99.11 lakh crore to investor wealth in a single day. During the entire trading session, 4,513 scrips were actively traded on the BSE. Of these, 3,585 stocks closed higher, 802 ended with losses, and 126 remained unchanged. On the NSE,

3,007 stocks saw active trading, with 2,656 advancing and 351 retreating. Among the 30 constituents of the Sensex, 28 closed higher and only 2 ended in the red. Of the 50 components of the Nifty, 47 gained while 3 slipped. The BSE's Sensex opened at 77,981.10, up 1,133.53 points. Within minutes of the opening, it surged another 1,422.85 points to reach 78,270.42. This sharp rally, however, did not last too long. Soon, profit-booking set in and selling pressure emerged, causing a mild dip in the index. Thereafter, the Sensex continued to trade

within a relatively narrow band, fluctuating just above the 77,000-78,000 zone. At one point, it slipped to 77,849.52 as selling spread. The reassuring aspect was that even amid these pullbacks, the Sensex never lost its 1,000-point cushion of positive bias. Eventually, the index closed the day 1,263.67 points higher at 78,111.24. Mirroring this move, the Nifty on the NSE began the day by leaping 321.15 points to 24,163.80. Within minutes, it jumped a further 438.25 points from its opening level to 24,280.90. Profit-booking then triggered a brief dip, pulling the index down to 24,145.80. However, even after multiple corrections, the Nifty managed to hold a positive bias of more than 300 points for most of the session. At the close, it ended 388.65 points higher at 24,231.30, registering a 1.63 per cent gain. Among large-cap stocks, InterGlobe Aviation, AETERNA, Max Healthcare, Power Grid Corporation, and TPV emerged among the top gainers, rising 4.76 per cent, 4.42 per cent, 4.03 per cent, 4.03 per cent, and 3.59 per cent, respectively. On the other side, Dr. Reddy's Laboratories, Bharti Airtel, and ICICI Bank were among the top laggards, closing 1.46 per cent, 0.81 per cent, and 0.22 per cent lower, respectively.

India's LPG Tanker Jag Vikram Docks Safely at Kandla Amid Hormuz Blockade Relief

New Delhi, 15/4 (H.S.): Amid the ongoing US blockade in the Strait of Hormuz, India's LPG tanker Jag Vikram successfully reached home soil. Carrying 20,400 metric tons of LPG, the tanker arrived at Gujarat's Kandla Port today—the first Indian vessel to traverse the strait following the two-week temporary ceasefire between the US and Iran. The LPG tanker Jag Vikram navigated the Strait of Hormuz on April 11. Since early March, it marks India's ninth ship to exit via the strait's western segment. Prior to the West Asia tensions, 28 Indian vessels were positioned around the Strait of Hormuz, with 24 in the western part and four stranded in the eastern segment. Before the two-week temporary ceasefire commenced between Iran and the US, eight Indian ships had safely exited the strait's western portion, while two more cleared



the eastern side. Now, LPG tanker Jag Vikram has also transited the western part and reached India safely. However, several Indian vessels remain stranded near the Strait of Hormuz, as do numerous foreign ships in the Persian Gulf, awaiting resumption of normal passage. Notably, India relies heavily on imports for its petroleum needs. The country imports approximately 88

percent of its crude oil requirements from international markets. Similarly, about 50 percent of natural gas and 60 percent of LPG are imported. Most supplies of crude oil and gas from Gulf countries transit via the Strait of Hormuz; however, since the West Asia conflict erupted, this route has nearly ground to a halt, severely disrupting India's LPG supply.

India Ranks Among World's Most Advanced AI Markets: OpenAI

New Delhi: US tech giant OpenAI on Wednesday said that India ranks among the world's most advanced AI markets, mainly in coding, data analysis and complex reasoning. India ranks among the top five nations globally in thinking capability usage per person, measured using reasoning tokens used by ChatGPT Plus users, the release from OpenAI said. The country is one of the fastest growing AI builder ecosystems with four-fold growth in Codex users in just two weeks after the launch of the company's Codex app in February 2026. AI usage in India remains highly concentrated in a handful of cities, with advanced use even more unevenly spread, said the company, highlighting a significant opportunity to expand access beyond early adopters in the top few



cities. "The central question now is how quickly the benefits of AI can extend beyond early adopters and leading cities to the wider population. Closing this gap will require expanding access, building skills, and enabling more meaningful use across the country, an effort

shaped in large part by India's young, fast-adopting population", said Oliver Jay, Managing Director, International, OpenAI. Advanced capability is highly concentrated as the top 10 cities account for about 50 per cent of AI users, representing less than

10 per cent of the population. Delhi-NCR has the highest population penetration of ChatGPT in the country. While India has competitive AI capability, its deepest advantages are clustering in a small number of urban hubs, including Bengaluru, Hyderabad, Delhi, and Chennai, it noted. The Capability Gap findings highlight that beyond the top cities, some of the most meaningful use cases are emerging in areas like education and health, indicating how AI is already being used in everyday contexts. In advanced use cases, the company noted wide intra-regional gaps, with data analysis usage up to 30 times higher in leading cities compared to lagging cities. Coding usage was found to be four times higher and Codex developer usage nine times higher.

Remarkably, the second film attained these figures despite facing theatrical bans in several Gulf nations and lacking a release in the lucrative Chinese market. Success for this series stems from its dominance in the domestic Hindi circuit. Dhurandhar 2 recently became the first film in Indian history to net over ₹1,000 crore in a single language within India. This specific regional triumph highlights a shifting trend where high-concept spy thrillers are now rivaling the mass-appeal masala entertainers of the South. Even with the ongoing excitement of the IPL season, the film maintains steady footfalls, recently outearning the fourth-week collections of blockbusters like Jawan and Stree 2. Adding to its commercial pull is the gritty realism of its setting. Most of the action unfolds in Lyari, Karachi, providing a raw backdrop that contrasts with the glossy aesthetics usually seen in Bollywood spy sagas. By intertwining fictional heroics with real-world events like the 26/11 attacks and the Kandahar hijack, the writers have created a sense of "Information Gain" that resonates with audiences seeking more than just stunts. This grounded approach has proven that Indian viewers are ready for sophisticated, geopolitically aware storytelling. Trade experts suggest the franchise still has room to grow before its eventual digital debut on JioHotstar. With the current momentum, the series is not just a commercial hit but a blueprint for future Indian cinematic universes. As the industry looks toward 2026, the benchmark set by Aditya Dhar and Ranveer Singh remains the ultimate goal for every major production house in the country.

Italy Pioneers Grass-Court ATP Spectacle Ahead of Wimbledon from 2028

Rome, 15/4 (H.S.): Bolstering its ascendant stature in global tennis, Italy will host a novel grass-court ATP tournament prior to Wimbledon starting 2028. The Italian Tennis and Padel Federation has acquired rights to the ATP 250-level event currently held in Brussels each October, relocating it to June in Italy. Federation President Angelo Binaghi announced Tuesday that while the venue remains pending finalization, climatic considerations favor northern Italy as the likely host. He hinted at Milan's iconic San Siro Stadium as a prospective site, where grass courts could be laid within the football pitch. Binaghi noted that practice courts inside Madrid's Santiago



Bernabéu for the Madrid Open render this concept far from unprecedented. Italy previously hosted a women's grass-court tournament in Gaiba from 2022 to 2024. Additionally, the nation will stage ATP Finals in Turin through 2030 and Davis Cup Finals in Bologna through next year. Meanwhile, preparations for the Italian Open intensify ahead of next month's edition. Jannik Sinner's recent Monte Carlo Masters final triumph over

Carlos Alcaraz fuels hopes he could become Italy's first men's singles champion there in 50 years. The federation revealed that construction of a retractable roof over the Italian Open's main 'Campo Centrale' court will commence immediately post this year's event, targeting completion by 2028. Stadium capacity will subsequently expand from 10,500 to 12,400 seats. Binaghi affirmed ambitions to elevate the Italian Open into tennis's fifth Grand Slam, alongside the Australian Open, French Open, Wimbledon, and US Open. He declared, "We contemplate this goal daily. It represents a slender opportunity, yet securing it would yield enduring benefits for Italy. This is our dream."

Sindarov Seals Candidates Glory One Round Early, Extends Unbeaten Streak to 50 Games

New Delhi, 15/4 (H.S.): Rising Grandmaster Javokhir Sindarov delivered a masterclass in the FIDE Candidates 2026 Open section, clinching the title on Tuesday with one round remaining. Drawing against Anish Giri in Round 13 secured his lead and the championship. This triumph earns Sindarov the right to challenge reigning World Chess Champion D. Gukesh in the forthcoming FIDE World Chess Championship. Remarkably, Sindarov remained unbeaten throughout, extending his invincible run to 50 consecutive games. Sindarov held a two-point lead entering Round 13. Giri needed a victory to keep the contest alive until the final round, but the draw clinched the title for



Sindarov. Giri opened with 1.e4, met by Sindarov's robust response. By move 15, multiple exchanges led to a queenless middlegame favoring Sindarov's strategy. Giri pressed on the d-file, but Sindarov's precise defense neutralized every plan. The game transitioned to a rook-and-knight endgame offering no

Kirori Mal College Clinches Dramatic Baba Deep Singh Basketball Title

New Delhi, 15/4 (h.s): Kirori Mal College clinched the men's category title of the 5th PSPB Baba Deep Singh Basketball Tournament, organized at Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Khalsa College of Delhi University on Tuesday night. The final match proved intensely thrilling, extending into extra time. Ultimately, Kirori Mal College defeated the host Khalsa College by a razor-thin margin of 79-78 to claim the championship. Dev Kapoor of Kirori Mal College was adjudged 'Man of the Match' for his stellar performance in the final, while Hardik Sharma of Khalsa College received the 'Player of the Tournament' award for his outstanding contribution throughout the event. South Campus Director Prof. Rajni Abbi graced the prize distribution ceremony as chief guest.

Chaos at Vijay's Tiruppur rally: 15 faint in sweltering heat, campaign event cancelled

Tiruppur (Tamil Nadu), 14/4: A major election rally for Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam (TVK) president Vijay was abruptly cancelled in Tiruppur district on Tuesday after at least 15 supporters collapsed due to severe heat and overcrowding. Following the incident and severe congestion, a scheduled six-kilometre roadshow by the leader was cancelled on police advice. The incident occurred as thousands of supporters gathered hours in advance to catch a glimpse of the actor-turned-politician during his intensive campaign tour for the 2026 Tamil Nadu Assembly Elections. The rally, which was expected to be a massive show of strength in the textile hub of Tiruppur, turned chaotic as the afternoon temperatures soared. The crowd began assembling at the venue from 10 a.m. in anticipation of the campaign. Vijay, who was expected to address the public at 4 p.m., arrived at approximately 4:45 p.m. Due to the scorching sun and high temperatures during the afternoon, 13 women and two men fainted. They were immediately transported to nearby hospitals via ambulance for medical treatment. Local volunteer teams and police personnel rushed the affected individuals to nearby primary health centres. Most are reported to be in stable condition. Upon receiving news of the medical emergencies and the deteriorating crowd conditions, Vijay and the TVK leadership decided to



cancel the address to prevent a repeat of the tragic 2025 Karur stampede. Following a campaign event at the Perumanallur Four Road junction, Vijay was scheduled to travel to Pooluvapatti as part of a roadshow. Although the police had granted permission, a massive influx of supporters along the Perumanallur-Tiruppur stretch led to severe congestion, making movement impossible. Based on police advice, the roadshow was called off, and Vijay subsequently left for Coimbatore via the Salem-Cochin National Highway. The incident follows a recent stampede in Karur, which resulted in the deaths of 41 people. Following a Supreme Court order emphasising the need for an independent probe, the Karur stampede case was transferred from a state-level Special Investigation Team (SIT) to the CBI.
